We have chosen the Forest Outreach Center at Berea College for this year's meeting. This will, weather permitting, allow us to get into the field to observe practices that will help you form and carry out your forest management plan. Meeting topics include water wells, management plans, fire as a management tool, carbon programs, forest value and record keeping, white oak initiative and climate change. - National Woodland Owners Association (NWOA) January 10th "Woodland Word" shared an NBC News Item that brought attention to a lack of funding focus for addressing **Beech Leaf Disease** and some new research indicating the beech leaf-eating nematodes cause cellular damage in the trees similar to the effect cancer cells have in mammals. USDA Helps Producers Prepare for and Recover from Severe Winter Weather

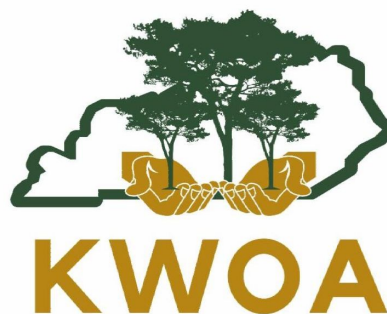
