KWOA's 2017 Annual Meeting convenes at Natural Bridge State Park March 28-29



Mark your calendar and register today to attend our annual meeting March 28-29 at Natural Bridge State Park in Slade, Kentucky.

"Natural Bridge State Resort Park is home to the great natural sandstone arch that stands like a sentinel over this mountain hideaway. Located in the midst of the Daniel Boone National Forest, near the Red River Gorge Geological Area, the arch spans 78 feet in length and 65 feet in height. Visitors will find this park a kaleidoscope of spectacular natural beauty with each passing season."

The theme for this year's meeting is Economic and Manufacturing Perspectives. The event will begin with a millwork and a sawmill tour on Tuesday morning, March 28th. The annual meeting will begin with lunch at the park followed by several professional presentations on topics of interest to woodland owners. Social time, a banquet, the infamous Woodland Quiz, and guest remarks and recognitions will round out the evening.

Educational seminars will continue on Wednesday morning, March 29th as well as updates from KWOA cooperators - government departments and public and private sectors involved in forestry. A short business meeting and election of 2017 officers and board will conclude the event. Attendees are encouraged to stay for lunch and park activities on their own.

The operation is at Exit 16 off of the Mountain Parkway. Turn toward Clay City and take the first road to the left that will parallel the Parkway. Follow

the road about 1/2 mile and the operation will be on the right and the office is a large Log Cabin and a sign is located out front.

H & S Lumber is at the end of the same road. That tour will include the sawmill and a log grading demonstration.

The tours should conclude by 11:30 a.m. with an easy return to the Parkway and on to the meeting at Natural Bridge State Park.
