KWOF Forestry Student Scholarship Awarded to Dennis Keowan

Kentucky Woodland Owners Foundation (KWOF) is pleased to announce and award its 2015 Forestry Student Scholarship to Dennis Keowan, a senior forestry major at the University of Kentucky. The purpose of the scholarship is to provide an award to an

outstanding student enrolled at the University of Kentucky's professional forestry degree program. Awards are granted on the basis of leadership potential, connection with the forestry community and insight for the forestry profession. The scholarship is in the amount of \$1,000 paid directly to the University of Kentucky for tuition fees.

Mr. Keown is a graduate of Ohio County High School. Dennis grew up in a family of loggers and has had the opportunity to have worked as an intern for Dunaway Timber Company. "There was no other place I would have rather been than the Forestry Department at the University of Kentucky," Dennis writes in his scholarship application.

Beyond the formal training that is required to become a professional forester, Keown has provided his services to the Department of Forestry's Forestry Club as secretary until elected president his senior year. Additionally, Keown is a member of Alpha Gamma Rho throughout his tenure at the University

and has been secretary as well as vice president of house operations. "Both organizations taught me a lot about working within groups and how to simply be a better person through leadership and volunteering", remarks Keown.

Dennis will be joining us at our 2016 KWOA Annual Meeting in March 7 and 8. Please take the time to introduce yourself to Dennis, the latest recipient of KWOF's forestry student scholarship.

A letter of reference from one of Dennis' professors makes the comment, "....Dennis is a dedicated student who approaches school in a very professional manner. He is well engaged in his course work....and excels out of the classroom and shows an important commitment to the profession of forestry as well as the wood industry of the Commonwealth."

Directions to

Lake Cumberland 4-H Leadership Center

- From Somerset travel west on the Cumberland Parkway.
- Exit at the Nancy Exit (78) approximately 10 miles from Somerset.
- Turn left at the stop sign.
- Travel approximately 1/4 mile over the Parkway.
- Just beyond the church on the right, turn right on the small road.
- You will see the first of the Center's directional signs.
- The perception of distance from this point becomes exaggerated.
- Set your odometer for three miles.
- At the end of three miles turn right onto 196.
- Set your odometer for 17 miles.
- Turn left, continuing on 196 (there is a small store/gas station on the right at this turn).
- Set odometer for 5 miles.
- At the end of the five miles you will see the Center on your left as you leave the pine woods.
